OPSEC is the "practice of safe-guarding any information that is relevant to movement, unit strength, and unit capabilities with technology, ammunition, or skill set." OPSEC protects planned and completed operations. Family members of the military community play an important role in protecting our soldiers.

We would like to remind all soldiers, spouses, family members, and friends to conceal all classified information such as flight schedules, temporary duty locations, installation activities, deployments, annual training, or even drill weekends. Please be vigilant in the information you are giving out on the internet, facebook, twitter, or in blogs. We need to protect our soldiers so they can complete their mission in the safest and quickest way.

ANTI-TERRORISM TRAINING

The 42nd CAB will be performing anti-terrorism training at the August drill. Soldiers are required to view the community awareness videos on anti-terrorism. SSG Michael J. Smith was born in Bayshore, NY and enlisted in the Army Reserves in December 1991. He completed basic training at Fort Jackson, SC in August of 1992 and served as a Fire Direction Control Specialist (MOS 13E) in the 7th BN, 9th Field artillery out of Melbourne, FL.

SSG Smith entered active duty as a Food Service Specialist (MOS 92G) in 1994. His first assignment was with the HHD, 6th ordinance Battalion at Camp Carroll, Korea. His second assignment was with the C Battery 2/43 ADA at Fort Bliss, TX. In 1996, he deployed to Saudi Arabia in support of Operation Southern Watch.

In 1997, he enlisted in the New York National Guard and was assigned to the HHC 42nd Aviation Brigade as a Food Service Specialist. In 2004, he returned to active duty when he was mobilized with the HHC 42nd Aviation Brigade in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom. In July 2006, he re-enlisted as a Topographical Analyst (MOS 21U). He is currently with the HHC 42nd Aviation Brigade serving as a Senior Geospatial Engineer.

His awards include the Army Commendation Medal (40LC), Army Achievement Medal (30LC), Army Good Conduct Medal, National Defense Service Medal (2), Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal, Global War on Terrorism Service Medal, Iraqi Campaign Medal, Korea Defense Service Medal and the Humanitarian Service Medal.

Geospatial Engineers go through a six month basic course at Fort Belvoir, Va. In addition, Geospatial Engineer Basic Noncommissioned Officer's Course is a five month course for Sergeants and above at Fort Belvoir, VA. Students work on three briefings, strategic, operational, and tactical. Each brief takes approximately a month to research and produce a 30-45minute brief.
