My name is SPC Stephanie Saunders out of the 42nd Combat Aviation Brigade in Latham. I am twenty-four years old and I am married to my husband Jeremy and have a five year old son Landan. My MOS is 15P aviation operations. As a 15P, I keep track of the incoming and outgoing flights, track flight hours for pilots, and communicate with the aircraft over the radios. I also attend college part time for substance abuse counseling at Adirondack Community College in Queensbury. I was selected to compete for the Solider of the Year Board and am currently on ADOS orders to help support the CSMRF mission (Homeland Security) for the 3/142 Aviation Battalion.

Specialist (SPC)

After completing Basic Training and Soldiers specialty training, a Warrior becomes a Soldier. After serving a minimum of 2 years and attending a training school, a soldier earns this promotion. Warriors who enlist with a four-year college degree can enter Basic Training Soldiers specialty training as a Specialist. The insignia for a specialist is the PFC rank with the chevron pointing down, the rocker on top and an eagle in the middle.



ARMY NEWS:

A dedication ceremony took place on April 23rd at the Fort Huachuca Air Park. The purpose of this dedication ceremony was to recognize the 139 fallen Soldiers who had lost their lives flying for the Army. Many of the attendees at the ceremony were Soldiers or civilians who had flown aerial reconnaissance missions in two of the four aircraft on display at the park. A black granite stone monument was etched with each of the 139 fallen Soldiers.

DISCOUNTS & UPCOMING EVENTS

Lowe's Military Discount:

Home improvement retailer, Lowe's, offers a 10% discount all day, everyday for active-duty, National Guard, reserve, retiree, disabled service members, and military spouses. In order to receive the discount, you must present a valid military ID card.

The discount applies to in-stock purchases up to \$5,000, but it does exclude online sales and purchases of gift cards.

Home Depot Discount:

In following suit with Lowe's, Home Depot offers a 10% discount all day, everyday for active duty personnel, reservists, retired, disabled veterans, and their immediate families. In order to receive the discount, you must present a valid military ID card.

The discount applies to purchases up to \$500, but does exclude online sales purchases or in addition to existing discounts or promotions.

The First-Tee Golf Program:

Children of geographically separated Guardsman and Reservists are able to attend a golf and life skills program *FREE* of charge at one of the First-Tee chapters in your community.

There are participating locations all over New York. In order to participate, go to www.thefirsttee.org. Once at the website, click on programs, and the Department of Defense. You will need to download a brochure and coupon in order to get your child into the free program.

Here's to the Hero's:

Any active duty, activated or drilling reservist, or National Guardsman and three direct dependants are entitled to *FREE* admission at Theme Parks Operated by SeaWorld Parks & Entertainment.

This is Valid for one complimentary single-day admission per person, per year, to one of the following: SeaWorld Orlando, San Diego, or San Antonio, Busch Gardens Tampa Bay or Williamsburg, Sesame Place, Water Country USA, or Adventure Island.

In order to get free admission you must either register online at www.herosalute.com or in the entrance plaza of a participating park and show valid military ID.

Discounted Baseball Tickets:

The New York Mets offer a FREE ticket to Military Personnel and a discounted ticket for a guest. The ticket must be purchased the day of the game at the box office, just show your military ID. The offer is valid for most games, except for game against the Yankees, and the most popular games played. Contact the ticket office to verify a game qualifies.

The New York Yankees offer a free ticket to Military Personnel. This applies to non-premium games Monday-Thursday. The ticket must be purchased the day of the game at the box office, just show your military ID. The tickets apply to seats in the Bleachers, the Grandstand, and parts of the Terrace. Premium seats are offered at half price.

Summer Camps for Military Children:

Operation Purple is from 8/1/10—8/6/10. This is an overnight camp just outside the western edge of the Adirondack Park. This camp is for children who are 8-12 years old and is *FREE* to all Military Youth. Some examples of the activities the children will participate in are swimming, crafts, boating, campfires, mountain biking, horseback riding, archery, and various sports. Registration is fill however the camp does expect some to drop out. The camp is accepting registrations for a waiting list. 
2010 Summer Camps:
