# Dr Martin Luther King Day – January 19th

A Baptist minister, Dr. Martin Luther King became a civil rights activist early in his career. He led the 1955 Montgomery Bus boycott and helped found the Southern Christian Leadership Conference in 1957, serving as its first president.

King's efforts led to the 1963 March on Washington, where King delivered his "I Have a Dream" speech. There, he raised public consciousness of the civil rights movement and established himself as one of the greatest orators in U.S. history.

In 1964, King became the youngest person to receive the Nobel Peace Prize for his work to end racial segregation and racial discrimination through civil disobedience and other non-violent means.





By the time of his death in 1968, he had refocused his efforts on ending poverty and opposing the Vietnam War, both from a religious perspective. King was assassinated on April 4, 1968, in Memphis, Tennessee. He was posthumously awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom in 1977 and Congressional Gold Medal in 2004; Martin Luther King, Jr. Day was established as a U.S. national holiday in 1986.

At the White House Rose Garden on November 2, 1983, President Ronald Reagan signed a bill creating a federal holiday to honor King. Observed for the first time on January 20, 1986, it is called Martin Luther King, Jr. Day. Following President George H. W. Bush's 1992 proclamation, the holiday is observed on the third Monday of January each year, near the time of King's birthday.

### MONTHLY EEO TRAINING!



Rehabilitation Act of 1973

The U.S. Rehabilitation Act of 1973 prohibits discrimination on the basis of disability in programs conducted by Federal agencies in programs receiving Federal financial assistance, in Federal employment, and in the employment practices of Federal contractors. The standards for determining employment discrimination under the Rehabilitation Act are the same as those used in Title I of the Americans with Disabilities Act.

SEPM's focus on inter/intrapersonal and organizational aspects of EEO, and program management skills. Training introduces the causes and effects of discrimination, EEO programs for federal employees/applicants for employment, civilian personnel/human resource management and valuing diversity. The programs that SEPM's work on are Federal Women's, Black Employment, Hispanic Employment, Asian-Pacific Islander Employment, American Indian/Alaskan Native Employment, and Programs for People with Disabilities Program.
