

CHILD CARE FOR MILITARY FAMILIES

OPERATION MILITARY CHILD CARE

Child care fee assistance for families of activated or deployed National Guard and Reserves for licensed child care.

Service members that are on Title 10 Orders are eligible. If your orders say Title 32 but you are in support of an operation, you are eligible for this subsidy, for example: Rear Det NCO's.

All income levels and ranks are eligible.
ALL RECRUITERS ARE ELIGIBLE FOR SUBSIDY.

Child Care for Families of Severely Injured Military Service Members

NACCCRA and the Department of Defense (DoD) have partnered to provide families of severely injured military members with assistance to find and pay for safe, licensed child care services for a period of six months during their period of recuperation. The program is available nationwide wherever the injured member is receiving either inpatient or out-patient medical care.

Upon successful completion of training, State Parks practical examination, and medical clearance, all will receive a summer lifeguard job offer paying no less than **\$12.56** an hour.

Notes:

- 1. Each candidate must be sixteen years of age on or before June 21. 2008 (Proof of age required the first day).
- 2. A completed NYS Parks Lifeguard Medical Form must be submitted by the first day of the course. Forms are available from Tim Larkin.

There is a "pre course" test which consists of

A: Swim 550 yards continuously, using these strokes in the following order:

200 yards of front crawl using rhythmic breathing and a stabilizing, propellant kick. Rhythmic breathing can be performed either by breathing to the side or to the front.

200 yards of breaststroke using a pull, breathe, kick and glide sequence.

150 yards of either front crawl or breaststroke. The 150 yards may be a combination of front crawl or breaststroke.

- B: Starting in the water, swim 20 yards using front crawl or breaststroke, surface dive 7-10 feet, retrieve a 10-pound object, return to the surface, swim 20 yards back to the starting point with the object and exit the water without using a ladder or steps, within 1 minute, 40 seconds.
- C: Swim 5 yards; submerge and retrieve three dive rings placed 5 yards apart in 4-7 feet of water; resurface; and swim 5 yards to the side of the pool.
