

**Note. This letter was written on the same paper as the letter of July 22, but treated as a separate letter.**

July 24<sup>th</sup> 9 A.M.

We are now rapidly nearing Fort Monroe expecting to arrive at about 12 m. We have had a slight blow last night & this morning but not enough to retard our progress materially. Edward lands at the Fort to get our orders & we will then know our destination. Strange to say I have not suffered from sea sickness this voyage. I felt a little qualmish the second night but that soon passed over. I have suffered some from sick headache but I think when we land that will entirely disappear.

Edward sends his regards. He has not been sick this voyage either & I think the sea air does him good. It is considerably colder than it has been & we feel it considerably but I suppose when we land it will be warmer.
