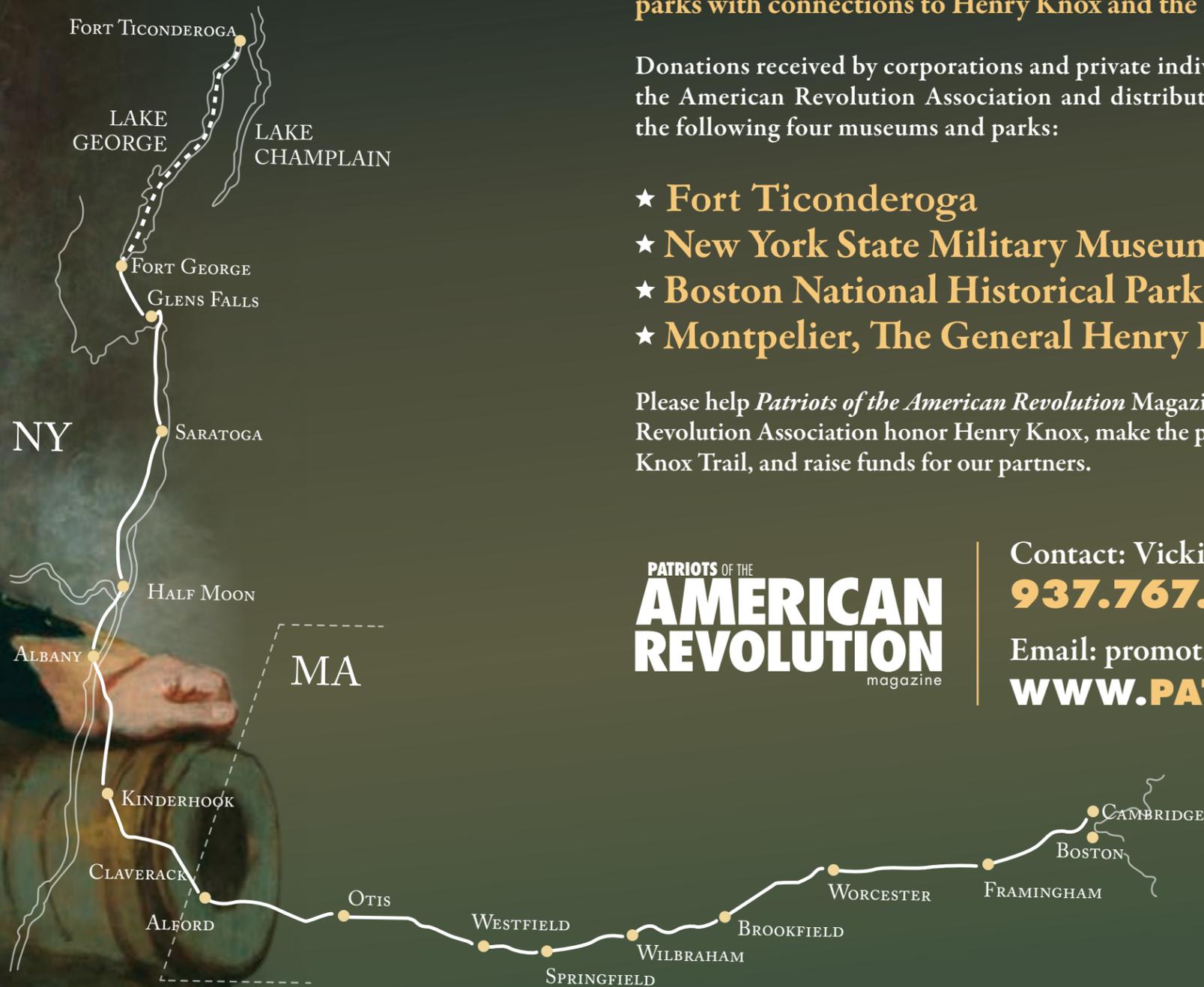
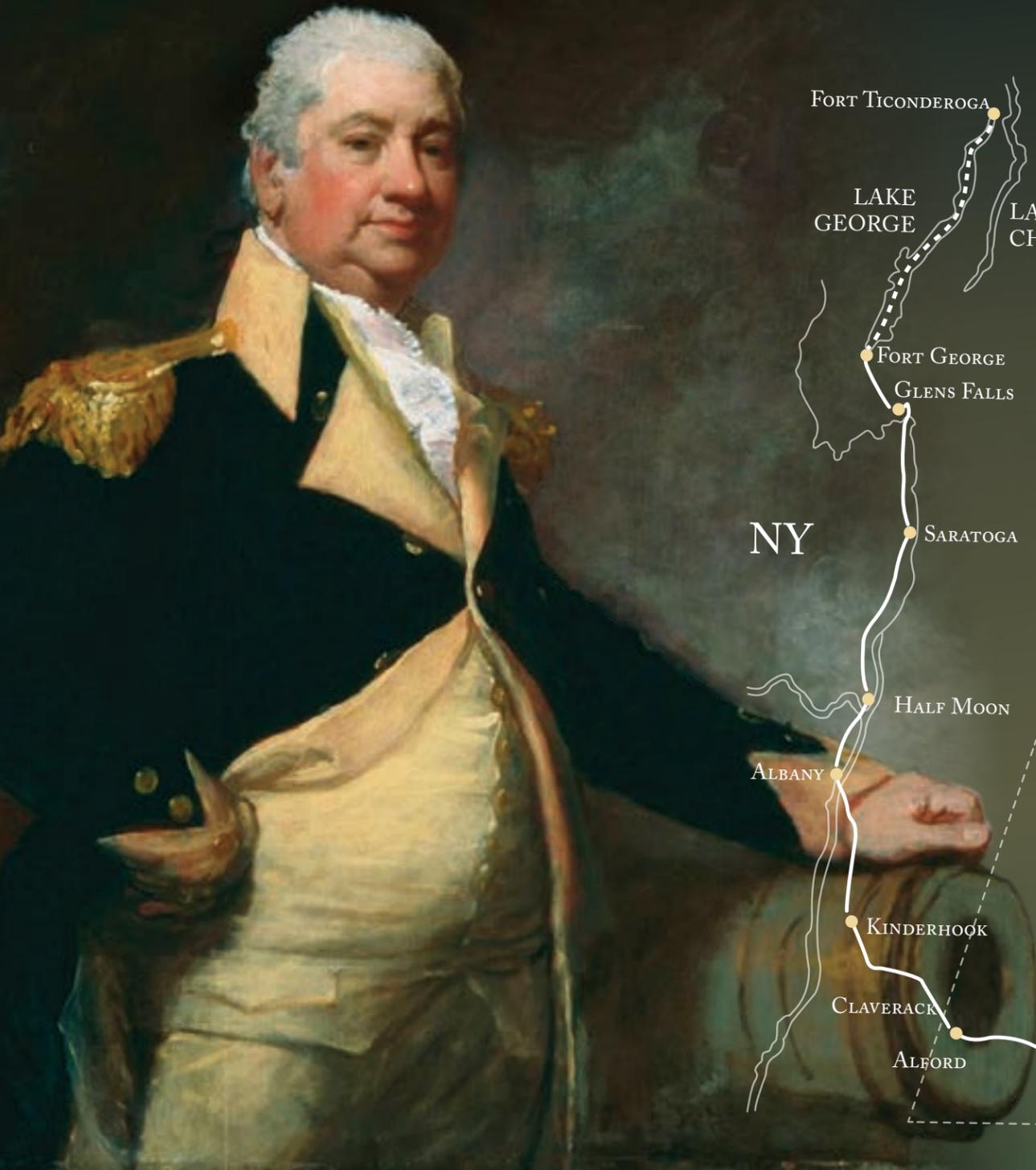


FOLLOWING THEIR FOOTSTEPS

Honor Walk



During the winter of 1775–1776, Colonel Henry Knox left Boston, marched to New York’s Fort Ticonderoga, and—with a team of men and oxen—hailed more than 50 tons of cannons and other arms back to Boston’s Dorchester Heights, which led to the British evacuation of Boston.

In April of 2012, Benjamin Smith and Alex Culpepper from *Patriots of the American Revolution* Magazine will walk the “Knox Trail” from Ticonderoga to Boston.
