What is The Family Foundations Program?

Family Foundations (<http://familyfoundations.ssri.psu.edu/>) is a program developed at Penn State that helps couples make the transition to parenthood in a healthy way. This period, when a couple has their first child, is often quite stressful for new parents. Family Foundations has been shown to have multiple benefits including:

- Reduced parent stress, depression, and anxiety
- Better couple teamwork and support around parenting
- Reduced family violence
- Warmer and more patient parenting
- Better child self-regulation, social adjustment, and school adaptation
- Fewer child emotional and behavior problems

Why adapt the program for military families?

Military families encounter stressors and challenges that are common to all families as well as those that are unique to the military lifestyle, including multiple relocations, long duty related separations, and the challenges related to combat exposure.

Who are we looking for?

Military Members and partners who:

- Are expecting their first child (0-7 months pregnant at time of enrollment)
- Are not expecting deployment within 6 months of starting the program

What will the participants do?

Couples will complete our new interactive, online program for new parents and participate in pre- and post-test surveys/interviews.

Is there compensation?

Each person will receive \$25 for each survey/interview they complete, up to \$100 per couple.

Family Readiness

Unit Family Readiness is a Commander’s Responsibility and the overall objective of the **Family Readiness Support Assistant (FRSA)** is to assist Commanders in the execution of that responsibility throughout all phases of the deployment cycle. FRSAs provide the Command with a “continuum of care” in Family readiness, coordinating the various resources that exist so that Commands, FRGs, and ultimately Soldiers and Families are as ready as possible for military life.

A **Family Readiness Group (FRG)** is an organization of Family Members, Volunteers and Soldiers, and Civilian employees. They belong to a unit or organization which provides an avenue of mutual support and assistance. It is a network of communication for the Family Members, the chain of command and other community resources. The Mission of the Family Readiness Group

- Helping Families become more knowledgeable and self- reliant
- Reducing stress and promoting Soldier and Family Readiness
- Providing an opportunity for Families to meet
- Contributing to the well-being, morale and spirit of the unit
- Coping with common issues and the challenges of military life

Benefits of the FRG:

- For Family Members: mutual support and care
- For Soldiers: peace of mind
- For Commanders: force multiplier
- For the Military and civilian communities: referral and resources
- For the Army National Guard: successful FRG programs enhance Family Readiness and deployment preparedness, thereby increasing unit readiness for military missions.

Through May 2016, there is currently a \$250 grant available to offset the course costs (regular cost is \$500 for this 10-week course) with valid proof that you are a military veteran.



Required Knowledge, Skills, and Abilities:

- Ability to adapt to changing environments
- Strong writing and communication skills

Required Academic and Experience Qualifications:

- Must be a U.S. Citizen, national, or lawful permanent resident alien
- 4 year degree in any major required
- Able to provide the following documentation: birth certification, driver's license or state photo ID, social security card, and high school diploma or college degree
- Must undergo a national criminal history check *REQUIRED*

Benefits members receive:

- An annual living stipend of \$11,676, which is paid out in bi-weekly increments.
- An AmeriCorps Eli Segal Education Award of \$5,730 OR \$1,500 cash stipend provided after the successful completion of the term of service
- Post Service federal employment incentives and opportunities
- Basic health insurance
- Ability to put qualified federal student loans on forbearance during the term of service
- Child Care assistance to those who qualify
- Monthly professional development and multiple training opportunities







January is National Braille Literacy Month

Braille is a unique form of reading and writing, a system which was invented by Mr. Louis Braille {January 4th 1809 - January 6th 1852} in the year 1825.

Louis Braille was a blind Frenchman who was unable to read and write, and due to this, he developed the "unique" **Braille system of reading and writing** which is known as the **Braille Alphabet**. The Braille Alphabet is named after Louis Braille himself.

Braille is widely used by blind people today who are unable to read and write the regular alphabets. Braille is very similar to regular alphabet letters - only different in the way characters are presented and read. People who are visually impaired can **read and write** just like everyone else!

The VFW Voice of Democracy contest provides students in grades 9-12 the opportunity to explore democratic ideals and principles through audio essays. The first-place winner receives a \$30,000 scholarship and a trip to Washington, D.C.

Patriot's Pen

The VFW Patriot's Pen essay contest is for students in grades 6-8 and challenges them to reflect on American history and their own experiences based on a patriotic theme. The first-place winner receives \$5,000 and a trip to Washington, D.C.

Scout of the Year

Each year the VFW honors three young people - from Boy or Girl Scouts, Sea Scouts or Venturing Crew - who have demonstrated exceptional citizenship in school, scouting and the community. The first-place winner receives \$5,000.
