

NEW YORK NATIONAL GUARD STIMULUS SPENDING

The New York Army National Guard has been allocated approximately \$10 million in federal stimulus money in order to upgrade infrastructure and pump money into local economies across the state.

Projects that have been awarded are:

- \$1.59 million to repair the road retaining wall on the road leading into Camp Smith Training Site near Peekskill has been awarded to Hirani Construction Management Inc of Jericho New York on August 3 by New York State Office of General Services. Work on the project is due to begin in September or early October and be finished in March 2010.
- \$346,360 to replace the heating and ventilation system at the New York Army National Guard's Rochester Army Aviation Support Facility awarded to Postler & Jackle Corp. Mechanical Contractors of Rochester on September 3. Work on the project is due to begin in September and finish in March of 2010.

Projects not yet bid, and the amounts allocated are:

- \$25,000 to install energy efficient lighting at Field Maintenance Shop 13 located at the Binghamton Armory at 85 West End Avenue.
- \$2.1 million to rehabilitate barracks building 504 at Camp Smith Training Site near Peekskill.
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- \$150,000 to replace the boilers at the Hornell Armory at 100 Seneca Street.
- \$1.5 million to install exterior insulation at Combined Support Maintenance Shop C at the Patriot Way Armory in Rochester.
- \$630,000 to replace the boilers at the Ronkonkoma Armory at McArthur Airport.
- \$1.5 million to upgrade a building at Fort Hamilton in Brooklyn that houses the New York National Guard's 24th Civil Support Team, a unit which is equipped to detect chemical, biological, or radiological weapons use.

Actual expenditures on these projects will vary based on the bids received from the contractors who will be hired to conduct the work.
