#### **ARTEP** is Here

At the end of the seventh week of post mobilization training at Fort Bragg, NC members of the 27<sup>th</sup> Infantry Brigade Combat Team are deep in their culminating evaluated training event known as the ARTEP. The brigade-wide exercise began on Thursday and runs through Saturday 15 March. The entire task force is operating under combat conditions within a tactical scenario based on the Afghanistan operational area of responsibility. Dozens of trainers from First U.S. Army are serving as Observer-Controller-Trainers and role players, and are challenging all levels of command down to the individual Soldier throughout the day and night. News media representatives from Rochester, Albany and New York City have come to cover the action impacting on their local unit. Brigade leaders received encouragement for their efforts under pressure from exercise leaders during an interim after action review during a short break in the action Sunday evening.
