# ARTEP is Over - Leave Comes Next!

The 27<sup>th</sup> BCT has completed the evaluated exercise successfully and training is nearly over. Eight weeks have gone by since the unit arrived at Fort Bragg, NC for post mobilization training. On Saturday 15 March, convoys returned to the Forward Operating Base from "patrol bases" that had been established under the training scenario. The day before, the FOB was attacked by insurgents using mortars and a suicide vehicle bomber at one of the gates. But the team was ready due to good intelligence which predicted the enemy actions. Medics, combat Life Savers and litter teams sprang into action in response to simulated casualties from the enemy fire. Army trainers praised the brigade's performance Saturday evening during the After Action Review. One retired Command Sergeant Major who was brought in to help with the training and mentor NCO leaders noted how much the team had learned in the short weeks it had trained at Fort Bragg. "Watching the mass casualty exercise was like watching a graduation ceremony – everything worked like clock-work," said Command Sergeant Major (retired) Dwight Brown.

#### Marine Pick Up
