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

MEMORANDUM FOR SEE DISTROBUTION

SUBJECT: Use of DA Form 5913 Strength and Feeder Report

1. Reference:
 - a. Army Food Management Information System (AFMIS) and Reserve Component Subsistence System (RCSS) Requirements Memorandum, dated 23 April 2014
 - b. Department of the Army Pamphlet 30-22, Appendix F. dated 6 February 2007
 - c. The Army Records Information Management System (ARIMS), AR 25-400-2, dated 2 October 2007
2. Effective 1 November 2014, all New York Army National Guard units, operating under the Army Food Management Information System (AFMIS), will be required to utilize the hardcopy DA Form 5913 (Strength and Feeder Report) for consolidated feeding operations only. AFMIS electronic meal requests will replace the DA Form 5913 requirement for all other feeding operations.
3. Consolidated feeding operations are any event in which a unit is being supported by another unit with catered meals, raw subsistence or operational rations. The unit being supported will forward a hardcopy copy DA Form 5913, request and report, through their command channels to the supporting unit. The supporting unit will consolidate any and all hardcopy DA Form 5913's and input that data into their AFMIS request and closeout. Both the supported and supporting unit will keep a hardcopy of the DA 5913 Strength and Feeder Report on file for three years IAW the ARIMS food service labeling requirement.


SUBJECT: Army Food Management Information System (AFMIS) and Reserve Component Subsistence System (RCSS) Requirements

1. References:
 - a. Army Regulation (AR) 30-22, Army Food Program, dated 24 Jul 12.
 - b. Memorandum for Record (MFR) Implementation of AFMIS for the Army National Guard, dated 16 Nov 2012.
2. The AFMIS system replaces all RCSS required forms in accordance with the references in paragraph 1 above. The RCSS is the mandatory accounting system for inactive duty training and annual training feeding not performed at an Active Army installation when AFMIS is not used or unavailable.
3. The AFMIS program replaces the following forms for Class A rations, contract/catered meals and operational rations:
 - a. DA Form 5913, Strength and Feeder Report
 - b. DA Form 3034, Production Schedule
 - c. DA Form 3234, Inventory Control Sheet
 - d. DA Form 5914, Ration Control Sheet (still required for operational rations only)
4. Commanders may designate the Food Operation Sergeant or other trained unit representatives using DA Form 1687 (Notice of Delegation of Authority-Receipt of Supplies) to request subsistence and food service support only under AFMIS. The signed DA Form 1687 must be submitted through command channels to the State Food Program Office.
