I stay at Home alone It all most  
makes me shudder. Couldn't you

would make It pleasant for me  
that would not be much trouble  
I guess now you will think talk  
is cheap. and that I am talking very  
simple. You say that you dont  
know when you will get to see  
me. all that I want to no is  
the day you are coming so that  
I will not be away from Florida  
for I some times are away a week  
at a time and I shurely dont want  
to be away when you come.
