<Monday, September 1, 1862>

This am we awoke facing battle, hits have occurred beside us. Hospital filled with wounded & dying – Attended to some hurt[?] men, ordered NY, but a terrific storm out in about 5 which punishes. But Kenney pressed them straight down the entire line. We started for Amfow[?], but roads filled there, sent with wind and
