## QUALIFICATIONS AND SELECTION FACTORS:

- Selection for this position will be made without regard to race, religion, color, creed, gender, or national origin.
- Applicants are subject to review by the FSS. As mandatory requirements are met, as outlined in applicable regulations, applicants must meet an Officer screening and Interview Board (OSIB).
- The requirements and qualifications prescribed in this announcement are a minimum for nomination for appointment consideration. Appointment is not assured merely by meeting these requirements. Persons considered must further qualify with requirements as outlined in applicable regulations.

### 1. DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

1. Executes cyberspace operations and information operations functions and activities. Plans, organizes, directs and executes cyberspace and information operations such as, Defensive Cyber Operations (DCO), Offensive Cyber Operations (OCO), Department of Defense (DoD) Information Network (DoDIN) Operations and Mission Assurance for Air Force weapons systems and platforms. Such operations cover the spectrum of mission areas within the cyberspace domain.

1.1. Plans and prepares for mission. Reviews mission tasking and intelligence information. Supervises mission planning, preparation and crew briefing/debriefing. Ensures equipment and crew are mission ready prior to execution/deployment.

1.2. Operates weapons system(s) and commands crew. Performs, supervises, or directs weapons system employment and associated crew activities.

1.3. Conducts or supervises training of crewmembers. Ensures operational readiness of crew by conducting or supervising mission specific training.

1.4. Develops plans and policies, monitors operations, and advises commanders. Assists commanders and performs staff functions related to this specialty.

1.5. Translates operational requirements into architectural and technical solutions. Works with commanders to deliver complete capabilities that include technical and procedural components. Researches or oversees research of technologies and advises commanders on associated risks and mitigation factors in conjunction with meeting requirements.

1.6. Directs extension, employment, reconfiguration, adaptation and creation of portions of cyberspace to assure mission success for combatant commanders. This includes both deliberate and crisis action scenarios.

## 2. SPECIAL QUALIFICATIONS:

2.1. Knowledge: Fundamentals of Computer Systems, Operating Systems, Software Applications and Architecture, Protocols, Addressing and Hardware. In addition, an Understanding of Networking Fundamentals, Network Infrastructure, to include Telecommunications Theory, Industrial Control Systems, and Data Communications/Links is needed. Officers must also be Proficient on Wireless Networking, as well as, Data Delivery to Personal Wireless Devices and understand Cryptography; to include Utilization and Exploitation Techniques. Cyberspace Operations and Information Operations Organization, Policies, Directives and Doctrine; Cyberspace Operations Systems and Fundamentals; Requirements, Acquisition, and Logistics; Cyberspace Operations Management, Utilization and Planning Principles.

2.2. Education. For entry into this position, vast majority of 17X Officers will possess Computer, Science, Technical, Engineering or Mathematic degrees.

2.3. Training: Must attend Undergraduate Cyberspace Training (Phase 1 and 2) as soon as possible after being accessed as a 17X1.

2.4. Experience. For upgrade to AFSCs 17D2X/3X, unit commander determines proficiency based on performance, experience and completion of minimum training requirements.

2.5. For award and retention of 17DX, specialty requires routine access to Top Secret or similar environment and completion of a current Single Scoped Background Investigation (SSBI) according to AFI 31-501, *Personnel Security Program Management*.

## OTHER QUALIFICATIONS:

Applicant(s) must be within Air Force height and weight standards at time of interview and must pass an Air Force Commissioning Physical. Must be 18 years or older and commissioned prior to his/her 35<sup>th</sup> birthday. All applicants must submit proof of citizenship and be citizens of the United States IAW Title 32, U.S.C., Section 313. A baccalaureate or higher degree from an accredited institution.

## OSIB:

An Officer Screening and Interview Board (OSIB) is scheduled to convene to interview all qualified applicants. Applicants will be informed in writing or by phone of date and time to appear.

Applicants will prepare and forward one copy of the AF Form 24; AFOQT Score; All DD214's(if applicable); Resume; Letters of recommendation. Current Official College Transcripts; vMPF Records Review RIP; Record of Separation/Discharge from the US Armed Forces (if applicable). Most current Physical Fitness Score(if applicable)
