The following is the status of the New York State Military Emergency Boat Service

1) ADMINISTRATION:

a. Realistically, the boat training season is already 35% complete. With the new policy of having all eligible MEBS members get paid for training, it is imperative that each member (not currently assigned to JTFES or Asylum Seeker mission) provide their regional coordinator with input for the training schedule. An email was sent to all MEBS this week providing guidance on how to get paid. The process for getting paid training approved is reiterated here:

<u>All MEBS, in order to get paid for training events (minimum two required for each member per year), follow</u> this flow chart and ensure compliance. Your regional coordinators are key to making the training schedule. As a reminder, here are the regional coordinators:

MEBS Training Pay Requirements Chart

Regional Coordinators provide input to Seasonal Training Plan. This will serve as a training schedule with pre-loaded dates of training. This document can be adjusted. Like an annual drill schedule for the Reserves, this Seasonal Training Plan will serve as a MEBS Training Event pre-approval.

MEBS members must have provided completed copies of NYNM INDOC and Direct Deposit form to HQ. Medical exam requirements must be current.

MEBS members submit SAD orders request in MEBS LOG app. In-pay requests are to adhere to the Seasonal Training Plan (see above). With advance coordination (at least two weeks), additional paid training events can be added.

SAD orders for paid training are approved and issued from HQ. No pay is authorized without orders specifying in-pay.

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Members complete the Pre/Post Medical Screening and submit to HQ (document upload portal) prior to and after the training.

At the start of the training event, all participants complete the SAD Attendance Register in MEBS LOG. This is to be done on just one person's smartphone. Do not fill out the Individual Attendance Register.

b. Our Non-Personnel-Services (NPS) budget for the current state fiscal year has been adjusted and the numbers are reflected below. Due to agency-wide challenges with the NPS budget, we in MEBS are reducing our budget from \$300,000 to \$202,500. NPS funding has nothing to do with pay. These figures reflect some sacrifices in certain areas and that we are over-spending on boat maintenance. Here are the changes we are making in the year-long budget:

- i. General: Reduced by \$5000 to \$10,000.
- ii. Boat Maintenance: Increased from \$80,000 to \$95,000
- iii. Truck Maintenance: Remains constant at \$3000
- iv. Trailer Maintenance: Reduced from \$3000 to \$1,500
- v. Travel/Per Diem: Reduced from \$30000 to \$20000
- vi. Boat Training Fuel: Remains constant at \$18,000
- vii. Truck Diesel Fuel: Remains constant at \$8000
- viii. Major Acquisition: Projected slight increase to \$47,000. This reflects a purchase of new SeaPro engines for LC-351, but not the purchase of new 4-Stroke 250HP engines for PB 281, which is being deferred.

2) **INFORMATION**:

a. **Port of New York and New Jersey**: In April 2024, the port moved a total of 709,469 TEUs (396,517 containers), a 9.4% increase compared to the same period last year. Year-to-April cargo volumes reached 2,710,918 TEUs (1,501,276 containers). Imports were strong, totaling 349,792 TEUs (196,960 containers) in April 2024, a 9% increase from April 20232. The port ended the first quarter of 2024 with a surge, surpassing 700,000 TEUs for the first time. Total volume reached 701,648 TEUs (386,868 containers), a 22% increase from March 2023.

b. **New York City Ferries**: New York City is commissioning its first public, hybrid-electric ferry. The vessel is expected to begin transporting tourists from Lower Manhattan to Governors Island in the summer of 2024. Additionally, New York Water Taxi plans to launch a high-speed, zero-emission, battery-powered ferry developed by Sweden's Green City Ferries





3) OPERATIONS:

a. MEBS is currently supporting the JTFES naval mission with three full-time detachments and four boats (PB-400 with DET 1 Verplanck, PB-440 DET 2 Staten Island, LC-351 DET 3 Jones Beach, and PB-300 DET 4 Tappan Beach). Since JTFES has only three full-time crews currently authorized, the DET 3 team is going back and forth with Jones Beach and Tappan Beach. To provide operational platforms for these four locations, we are juggling maintenance and boats to accommodate. We have some down-time slated for certain vessels, and these maintenance periods will be dependent on funding, parts, and the clearing of work before the next step can be taken.

- i. Our highest priority is LC-351 repairs, which are expected to be completed next week under warranty.
- ii. The next highest priority is PB-301 lower end unit repair. We must order a new lower end unit for this boat.
- iii. PB-400 needs to have bottom work. While the boat is currently FMC, our intent is to have the boat hauled for bottom inspection, sandblasting, and epoxy coating. We will also have inspection of the port strut to see if repairs are needed there that are causing problems with the port shaft. This combined work is estimated to be in the \$15-20K range. To support these jobs, PB-301 will have to be completed and then sent to DET 1 to replace PB-400.

4) LOGISTICS:

a. LC 351 is expected to go into All Island Marine on 18JUN for warranty work on the motor hydraulic trim. The motor has been slipping and it is a known problem with Mercury Marine. They have already sent the replacement part to the vendor.

b. PB 301 has been moved down to Station Jones Beach from Tappen Beach. On Tuesday, the LC 351 will be going in for Repairs and maintenance and PB301 will serve in its place.





c. PB 301 is NMC due to failure of the lower end on the port motor.

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d. PB 400 is FMC. The vessel was taken to Whites Hudson River Marina for shaft inspection which found that the alignment is satisfactory. However, there may be issues with the port strut that is causing the shaft to not turn smoothly. We will need to have the boat hauled out to inspect the bottom.
