

2) **INFORMATION:** The schooner Apollonia is the only working sail freighter in the U.S. Over its first three seasons shipping up and down the Hudson River, it has moved around 110,000 pounds of cargo and burned fewer than 10 gallons of diesel fuel. This vessel was moored at Hudson near the MEBS vessels during the Kick-off Weekend.
