1) ADMINISTRATION:



a. DMNA has once again been awarded a Port Security Grant. This FY 24 grant represents \$210,000 in federal funding for the next three years (starting 1 Sep 24) and is to be used to offset PB 440 maintenance.

b. We have adjusted our accounting for MEBS proficiency training payroll to include BAS. We had not been including that in the overall calculations, which have now increased a bit.

c. We have reassessed the boat deployment plan with JTFES. Upon completion of bottom work, PB 400 will return to the DET ONE mission at Verplanck. LC 350 shall remain the principal vessel for DET THREE at Jones Beach. This is primarily due to the JTFES troop movement plan, as well as the JFK Airport evacuation plan, both of which better suited with the landing craft.

2) INFORMATION: (*BreakingWaves*) It was a month of double-digit gains in June at the Port of New York and New Jersey. Total volume rose by 13.5 percent, with 708,935 TEUs (395,219 containers) moving through the port compared to the 624,512 TEUs (346,850 containers) recorded in June 2023. This increase brings the year-through June total to 4,210,611 TEUs (2,336,088 containers). June was the port's fourth consecutive month surpassing 700,000 TEUs, as well as its seventh consecutive month of year-over-year growth. The port maintained its status as the second busiest in the nation for loaded cargo over the first half of the year.

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4) LOGISTICS:

a. PB 220 trailer (8012) which had significant rust perforations on the frame has been repaired by the N4 shop. Unlike other boat trailers, the PB 220 trailers are made of steel. Installed running lights were a source of frame water penetration and were eliminated during this repair.

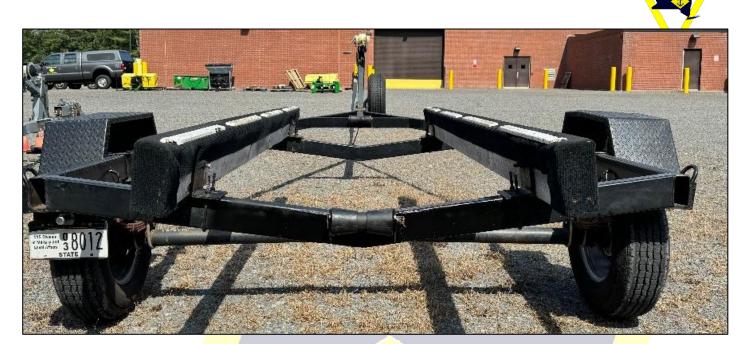












b. PB 400 bottom work continues. As part of the findings as the boat was hauled out, we found additional work on the strut bearings and rudders which are being completely re-worked by the vendor. Unless other issues arise, the ETR for PB 400 is 5 SEP 24. As a result of the increase in the scope of work, we have added nearly \$7500 to this project. Since the figure now exceeds \$20,000, we had to submit additional documentation along with a purchase order change notice. Since most of the growth work had to be completed to get to the work originally prescribed, it is already in progress or done.



PB 400 bottom after soda-blasting.









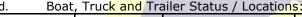
