SUBJECT: ARNG Training Support Systems (TSS) Funding

1. Purpose: To provide FY14 TSS funding distribution methodology.

2. Facts:

- a. The ARNG Training Support Branch (ARNG-TRS) annually distributes TSS Operations and Maintenance funding in support of three major programs: Range and Training Land Program (RTLP), Integrated Training Area Management (ITAM), and the Training Support Center (TSC) daily operations.
 - b. RTLP (MDEPs: VSCW, VSRM and VFRE)
 - (1) VSCW Range Operations
- (a) Overview. Supports day-to-day range operations expenses and funds the following centrally managed activities (contracts) and Training Budget (TBUD) requirements: Range Facility Management Support System Functional Administrators (RFMSS-FA), Targetry Centers of Excellence, unexploded ordinance support and special projects.
- (b) Distribution Methodology. FY14 funding was distributed proportionately (percentage of funding multiplied by the requirement) IAW installation-level Army Range Requirements Model (ARRM) requirements.
 - (2) VFRE Operation Enduring Freedom (OCO Funding)
- (a) Overview. Supports range operations and validated minor range construction projects in support of mobilization activities at training centers. Funds can supplement range operations at training centers or can be used to pay for range fees imposed by an out of State or other component training center.
- (b) Distribution Methodology. FY14 funding was distributed to States / Territories with greater than 240 Soldiers deploying ISO OEF. The amount was determined by dividing the overall number deploying forces (greater than 240) into the funding start point, and then distributed proportionally by State / Territory.

- (a) Overview. TATM funds the Integrated Training Area Management (ITAM) program which maintains, repairs and reconfigures maneuver land.
- (b) Distribution Methodology. FY14 funding distribution was based on approved requirements in the ITAM Workplan of the Range Complex Master Plan and past execution rates. The priority for funding is Category B projects, Cyclic (large equipment) Purchases and Category C projects. FY14 funding levels only supported funding of Category B projects and very limited Cyclic Purchases.

(1) such furloughed employees shall be compensated at their standard rate of compensation for such period;

(2) the State (or such other grantee) shall be reimbursed for expenses that would have been paid by the Federal Government during such period had appropriations been available, including the cost of compensating such furloughed employees, together with interest thereon calculated under section 6503(d) of title 31, United States Code; and

(3) the State (or such other grantee) may use funds available to the State (or the grantee), together with interest thereon calculated under section 6503(d) of title 31, United States Code.

(b) For purposes of this section, the term "State" and the term "grantee" shall have the meaning as such term is defined under the applicable Federal program under subsection (a). APPENDIX 7 – ARNG Sustainable Range Programs (SRP)

Section 701. General.

- a. This Appendix to the Master Cooperative Agreement prescribes the terms, conditions and administrative requirements related to the National Guard Bureau's (NGB's) Federal contribution for operations, management and maintenance of the Army National Guard Sustainable Range Program (SRP) cooperative agreement. The Sustainable Range Program includes the Range and Training Land Program (RTLP) and the Integrated Training Area Management (ITAM) program.
 - b. Statements of Fact.
- (1) The authorizations and provisions set forth in NGR 5-1 are incorporated into this Appendix by
- (2) Federal funding under the ARNG SRP will be on a requirements basis within Federal budget limitations. The ARNG SRP Appendix will fund only facilities coded TSC for support in the Facilities Inventory and than Federal funds.
 - (3) NGB is authorized to contribute 100% Federal funding for the ARNG SRP.
- (4) Federal funding under the ARNG Sustainable Range Program is not for State Military Department services covered under the SRM Appendix.

Section 702. Additional Definitions.

- a. VSCW: Funds day-to-day range operations expenses to include Operations & Maintenance (O&M) Range Mod projects, consumable supplies on ranges (e.g. target materials), local range ops and target/instrumentation maintenance contracts, operational UXO clearance, UXO clearance for MCA range projects, NEPA for range projects and land acquisition, misc services and personnel training and travel. Funds support to Army range programs provided by the executive agent and agencies managing Army-wide range program projects and initiatives, including range program support manpower functions for USACE, PEO-STRI, ATSC.
- b. TATM: Includes O&M funds to maintain the outdoor classroom to improve training efficiency, soldier and unit readiness and survivability by sustaining realistic training and testing lands through integration of land use requirements with land capability.

Section 703. Office of Primary Responsibility.

- a. The Office of Primary Responsibility for this Appendix is the Army National Guard Training Division, Training Support Branch (NGB-ART-S).
- b. Director, NGB-ART, for the purposes of this Appendix, is a designee of the Chief, National Guard Bureau. This individual or his designee (NGB-ART-S) is authorized to make final approval of all Operations and Maintenance budgets and modifications to them, and to the language of this Appendix. Also, to authorize distribution and recall of SRP Operations and Maintenance funds to the USPFO, to receive specified accounting reconciliation reports, to approve minor construction projects exceeding local USPFO authority, and to take any other action on behalf of NGB or the Chief, NGB, as specifically reserved under this Appendix for NGB-ART.

Section 704. Scope of Agreement.

- a. Scope of Services.
- (1) The Grantee shall provide SRP services for the operation, maintenance and repair of ARNG authorized ranges listed on FISP.
- (2) The Grantee may subcontract for the services herein described, if the required and appropriate paragraphs and clauses are included as prescribed in Articles VIII and IX of the MCA.

- b. Performance Specifications. Operations and Maintenance of the SRP shall include, but not be limited to actions by the Grantee, through employment by the Grantee, by contract or hire, of sufficient personnel, acquisition by contract of supplies or services, or other necessary actions, to accomplish the following tasks.
- Maintenance, operations and repair of ranges and training areas will be accomplished up to sound commercial practice or as specified. U.S. Army Standard Range and Targetry requirements are contained in Training Circular (TC) 25-8, Training Ranges.
 - Alteration or rehabilitation of ranges and training lands authorized by applicable law and regulation.

Section 705. Authorized Charges/Activities.

a. Personnel.

Costs for salaries, to include approved overtime, and benefits for SRP approved positions. (3)

- Payments for salaries, to include approved overtime and allowable benefits, in accordance with state personnel policy for the payment and benefits of like state government positions within the same geographic area. When there is no like state government position available, salaries and benefits will be equivalent to a comparable grade and series Federal Technician position in the geographic area. If a state has a pay raise, pay freeze, pay cap, a hiring freeze or employee furloughs for like positions throughout the state then SRP employees will have corresponding limitations.
- Benefit costs include Social Security contributions, workers compensation, medical and unemployment insurance (FICA) premiums and state retirement system.
- Costs for merit and incentive awards based on performance providing the awards are part of a program available and consistent with those offered to similar state government positions.
- Costs for travel expenses and per diem, at a rate consistent with state travel regulations and not exceeding the Federal Joint Travel Regulation (JTR) Volume II authorizations, for performing SRP activities away from their home office.
- Costs for training fees associated with certification, examinations, or licenses required by State or (5) Federal agencies for operations in support of the SRP Agreement.

b. Facilities.

- Costs to provide operations, maintenance and repair of components, equipment, or simulation (1) devices for supported range facilities.
 - Costs to fund design and modernization of facilities required for operations.
 - c. Special Machines, Tools, and Construction Equipment.
- Costs for the purchase of special machines, tools or equipment not exceeding \$2500. Costs exceeding \$2500 require USPFO verification that all conditions of the SRP Appendix are met. Federal reimbursement for the purchase of equipment authorized in the Table of Distribution and Allowances (TDA) with a list price in excess of \$2,500 is authorized only if: (a)
 - The item is required for the State to perform its responsibilities under the FP Appendix.
- The item is not for the principal use of someone or some function covered under 10 USC (b) Chapter 39, 32 USC Chapter 3, 32 USC 502, or 32 USC 709;
- It is not more economical to rent or lease the item; and it is more efficient for the State Military Department to procure the item.
- Costs for the rental of special machines, tools, or construction equipment may be supported when an economic analysis shows rental is more beneficial than procurement. Reimbursement for rental or lease of items for a period in excess of 240 days requires USPFO approval of an economic analysis showing that this is the most cost effective alternative to ensure the State Military Department meets its responsibilities under the FP Appendix.
- Costs for repairs to Grantee owned machines, tools, or equipment used solely in performance of the SRP by replacement of State-owned equipment is authorized.
- d. Commercial communications costs, including toll charges, are authorized, provided that they are directly in support of the SRP.

- e. Costs of Architectural and Engineering (A-E) Services consistent with the rates in NGR (AR) 415-5.
- f. Costs of supplies for maintenance of supported range and training lands equipment, and subcontracts for those items necessary to provide essential maintenance and repair services to authorized ranges.
- g. Costs of operational supplies, services and subcontracts for those items necessary to provide essential RTLP support for ranges and facilities and ITAM for training lands. Operational supplies are those items used or consumed in support of the execution of the SRP or the preparation of plans and/or specifications for construction, maintenance and repair projects completed by the FMO and supported by the SRP.
- h. Costs for Maintenance and Repair (M&R) Projects for ranges and facilities may be accomplished under the RTLP. Projects for training lands may be accomplished under ITAM. Repair by replacement of existing components, materials, and installed equipment that has become unserviceable or has deteriorated beyond economic repair is considered to be repair. Replacement items will be similar in character, nature, and capacity to the replaced item. Replacement items that are more durable and provide longer life may be used if they are economically justified. Maintenance or repairs will not exceed criteria that bring facilities to a state of utility in excess of that which is authorized by construction standards contained in NGB (AR) 415-10. If the estimated cost to repair an automated range exceeds 50 percent of the cost to construct a new automated range, a new range should be constructed. Construction projects which exceed the authority limits in this regulation should be programmed for MCARNG execution.
- i. Costs for Petroleum, Oil, and Lubricants (POL) used in the performance of this Appendix for State owned vehicles, tractors, lawn movers, etc.
 - j. Costs of Contracts/Subcontracts with Commercial Agencies.
- k. Costs of work or contracts associated with meeting National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) requirements.
 - I. Costs to complete Unexploded Ordinance survey documents.
 - m. Other services as approved by NGB-ART-S, prior to execution.

Section 706. Unauthorized Charges/Activities.

All charges/activities not authorized in Section 705 or that have not been approved by exception by NGB-ART-S are unauthorized.

Section 707. Budgets.

- n. The CA PM shall submit a budget each fiscal year as directed by NGB-ART-S for approval. The budget will list by AMSCO the SRP Operations, Maintenance and Repair activities to be funded and the amount for which it expects reimbursement from NGB.
- o. The funding limitation on the approved budget constitutes the maximum amount NGB intends to reimburse the State for its SRP Operations Maintenance and Repair activities under this Appendix. This budget shall be incrementally funded.
- p. NGB-ART-S, in its discretion, may unilaterally increase or decrease the budget total, the total for any facility, or the total for any line item.

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- q. The CA PM is granted flexibility to move funding within the AMSCO to adjust actual expenditures where they differ from the Budget.
- r. The CA PM shall reconcile budget amounts with NGB-ART periodically, 31 March, 30 June, and 30 September. This report is due 30 days after the "as of" date. If the Appendix funding is not closed out by the time the CA PM submits the last report, the CA PM shall so notate on that report and shall submit a final report when the Appendix is closed out. The CA PM shall submit any other requested financial or budget report that NGB-ART may require.
- s. The CA PM must submit a written request to NGB-ART-S when it wishes to decrease the federal funds in the Budget of this Appendix. The CA PM must furnish a copy of the said request to NGB-ART-S. The request will include an updated budget reconciliation report as an enclosure. The request will not take effect, nor can any expenditure of funds so implied therein take place, until it receives the approval of NGB-ART-S. The request shall not be binding unless it is so approved. The request and approval shall not be binding unless a CA modification to this appendix has been executed.
- (1) The written request shall be, on an instrument containing the signatures of both the USPFO and TAG, or authorized designees.
- (2) Budget changes not requiring a written amendment will be reflected in the periodic reports it is required to submit to NGB-ART-S.

Section 708. Appendix Administration.

t. Personnel Authorizations.

The following positions are authorized under this agreement: ITAM Coordinator, LCTA Coordinator, Geographic Information System (GIS) Technician and Land Rehabilitation and Maintenance (LRAM) Coordinator. NGB-ART-S must approve any exceptions to authorized personnel positions. The CA PM will submit, with the budget, the number and type of employees needed for maintenance and administrative and operation personnel as described in the AMSCO. Justification for each position is required and should address the purpose of the position (position description), the number of ranges or personnel supported, and any constraints that affect the number of employees needed. Costs should include basic salary, FICA contributions, and any allowable benefit packages. NGB-ART-S will notify the Grantee of the positions approved and funded, approved and unfunded, or disapproved. Expenditures for full time personnel should not exceed 60% of the approved Appendix budget.

- u. Facilities Inventory Support Plan (FISP.
- (1) Ranges and training lands eligible for Federal funding must be on facilities listed on the FISP. Ranges must be on the FISP with a category code in accordance with Army Training Circular 25-8 to qualify for support.
- (2) NGB-ART-S is the approving authority for facilities receiving support. The Department of the Army categorizes ITAM training centers support annually; requests for additions, deletions or changes to that each year.
 - v. SRP Budgets/Funding.
- (1) All funding and budget information is updated yearly on the ART-S Program Guidance Document that is distributed to the states in July for the next FY.
- (2) Funding for RTLP primarily comes from the MDEP VSCW with funding occasionally being provided through the VIRQ MDEP (will be specified on the FAD). Funding for ITAM is provided through the TATM MDEP.
 - w. Changes to the terns and or conditions of this Appendix will be IAW NGR 5-1, Chapter 3.

Section 709. Funding Limitation.

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- x. Approved Budget/Annual Funding Program (AFP): The total dollar amount that NGB anticipates, subject to the availability of funds, being available for reimbursement to the Grantee for its costs in fulfilling its responsibilities under this Appendix. This amount may be increased or decreased by NGB during the fiscal year.
- y. Total Dollars Obligated: The total amount of funds obligated for NGB's share under this Appendix. Only funds obligated through a modification to this appendix are available for reimbursement to the Grantee. Funds shall be obligated as received by the CA PM.
- c. Accomplished as In-Kind Assistance: The total dollars expended through Federal acquisition. This dollar amount may reflect anticipated In-Kind Assistance and be updated as IKA is approved, but as a minimum shall reflect the total dollars accomplished through In-Kind Assistance in support of this Appendix for each fiscal year as it occurs.
- d. Program Income: The gross income received by the Grantee from fees for services performed and from the use or rental of real or personal property, the operation and maintenance of which is supported under this Appendix. Program Income shall be added to the budget as a Grantee contribution regardless of the percentage of Federal contribution reflected in this Appendix. This dollar amount may reflect anticipated Program Income and be updated as Program Income is reported, but as a minimum shall reflect the total dollars received as Program Income for each fiscal year as it occurs.
 - e. The following funding limitations are provided for each fiscal year as it occurs:
