Description of Training:

Monday - Specialized SCBA Training

This course will include an overview of the safety features and limitations of the department's SCBA's Warning Devices, Emergency Bypass Operation, Medical Signs and Symptoms limiting the effective use of SCBA; review and demonstrate required emergency operations when an SCBA fails, review and demonstrate Required Emergency Operations related to self-rescue situations (reduced profile, quick escape, swim maneuver, etc.); review and demonstrate communications with facepiece in place including communications associated with SCBA emergencies (May Day Transmissions); review and demonstrate Emergency techniques using an SCBA to assist other members (RIC/UAC & EBSS)

Course consists of one session (3 hour) at the Fire Academy

Tuesday and Wednesday – Live Fire Training

Live fire training in Taxpayer and Tower Buildings meeting required NFPA Firefighter Recurring Training.

Thursday – Flashover

Flashover Simulator facility will enable our instructors to further enhance the safety of firefighters in interior firefighting operations and to spot the signs of flashover before it happens.

Thursday – Thermal Imaging Camera

Students will learn about thermal imaging technology and the operational considerations when using a thermal imaging camera. In addition there will be hands-on demonstration and practical exercises using the host Department's thermal imaging camera.

Friday - Hazardous Materials Refresher Class

Customized Haz-mat course prepares emergency response personnel to effectively and safely respond to and stabilize incidents involving hazardous materials in an offensive mode. Meets the training requirements of OSHA 1910.120 for Hazardous Materials Refresher Training. Includes the chemistry and toxicology of hazardous materials; the dangerous properties of chemicals; the use of detection instruments, confinements and containment procedures, including hands-on application; incident management and safety procedures; decontamination; and the selection and use of chemical protective clothing with hands-on practice.

(1) Uniform Material Performance: Station work uniforms shall comply with NFPA 1975, "Standard on Station/Work Uniforms for Fire and Emergency Services" and can be 100% natural fibers (reference Department of Defense Instruction (DODI) 6055.6. Flame retardant station work uniforms are not required.

(2) Station Work Uniform: The standard uniform for civilian fire fighters will consist of a uniform shirt, uniform trousers, belt, socks, footwear, Air Force Fire Protection Badge, name tag, epaulets or collar brass, and patches. If the fire department only has personnel who are military members, it will be at the discretion of the Installation Commander to have them wear the Battle Dress Uniform (BDU) in lieu of this uniform. Funding for civilian uniforms, not BDUs, will be included in the budget process. Authorized station work uniforms and associated information for replacement will be in accordance with AFI 32-2001 and ANG Sup 1, Attachment 10.

1. ANGFFPA fire fighters will support organization exercises, inspections and assessments, performing duties and services defined within this Appendix.

2. The CA PM or Grantee must submit a request through the USPFO to NGB-PARC-A when it wishes to change the instructions, terms, or conditions of this Appendix. NGB-PARC-A shall submit the request to NGB/A7XF for review and approval before acting on the request. If approved, the change shall not be binding until a modification to this Appendix is executed and signed by the grantor and grantee as required by NGR 5-1, Chapter 3.

3. The request will not take effect, nor can any expenditure of funds so implied therein take place, until it receives the approval of NGB/A7XF.

4. Modifications to this Appendix incorporating initial fiscal year funding will be sent by the CA PM to NGB/A7XF for review and concurrence.

Section 2409. Funding Limitation.

a. Approved Budget/Annual Funding Program (AFP). The total dollar amount that NGB anticipates, subject to the availability of funds, being available for reimbursement to the Grantee for its costs in fulfilling its responsibilities under this Appendix. This amount may be increased or decreased by NGB during the fiscal year.

b. Total Dollars Obligated. The total amount of funds obligated for NGB's share under this Appendix. Only funds obligated through an executed CA modification to the Appendix are available for reimbursement to the Grantee. Funds shall be obligated as received by the CA PM.
